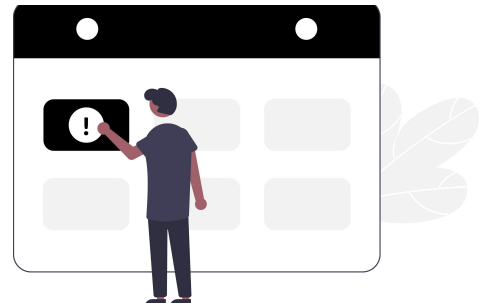


SHUTDOWN in ONTARIO

Accurate as of April 1, 2021



Gatherings and Close Contact

- It is illegal to gather indoors with anyone you do not live with.
- If you live alone, you can have close contact with only one other household.
- Maximum of 5 people outdoors for all events and social gatherings
- Maximum of 15% indoor capacity for religious, wedding and funeral services ONLY. This does not apply to receptions.

Essential Services

- Everyone who can work from home is urged to do so. Only go out for essential reasons, such as work, school, groceries, pharmacy, health care, helping vulnerable people, exercise and physical activity.

What's Open?

- Schools, child care centres, parks, and day camps
- Community centres and multi-purpose facilities (for example, YMCA) open for permitted activities (for example, social services)
- Restaurants for take-out, drive-through and delivery only
- 50% capacity limit for pharmacies, convenience stores and stores that primarily sell groceries
- 25% capacity limit for other essential businesses, for example, stores in shopping malls, stores that sell alcohol or cannabis, hardware stores, garden centres

What's Closed?

- Sports and recreational fitness services and facilities, for example, gyms and personal trainers
- Dine-in services and patio dining
- Non-essential businesses such as, cinemas, casinos, bingo halls, gaming establishments, in-person driving instruction
- Personal care services, such as hair and nail salons
