This survey is for all immigrants living or working in Waterloo Region. This includes people born outside Canada who are now permanent residents, temporary residents, Canadian citizens, or foreign nationals (including refugees, refugee claimants, international students and more).

This survey is anonymous and you do not have to provide your name. When you finish the survey, you can choose to enter your name into a draw for a prize.
